Techniques for Identifying and Managing Scope

Neville Turbit has over 15 years consulting experience in IT. He has worked for both Government and Private sector with particular emphasis on Project Management. His company - Project Perfect - sells Project Administrator software internationally with clients ranging from Carnegie Mellon University in the US to Brambles in Australia. The presentation will cover some of the reasons scope definition and management is such a difficult issue. We will look at some major failures and why they happened. It will then go on to describe a number of pragmatic techniques for estimating scope. The intention is to have you go away with the skills to apply those techniques in your own workplace.
