



## ACS Professional Standards Scheme Membership

The Australian Computer Society Professional Standards Scheme under the Professional Standards Act 1994 (NSW) is prepared by the ACS for the purposes of limiting occupational liability to the extent to which such liability may be limited under the Act.

The ACS has furnished the Professional Standards Council with a detailed list of the risk management strategies intended to be implemented in respect of its members and the means by which those strategies are intended to be implemented.

The scheme is intended to commence on 1st January 2016 and remain in force for five (5) years from its commencement unless, prior to that time, it is revoked, its operation ceases, or it is extended pursuant to section 32 of the Act.

The scheme is also intended to apply under the mutual recognition provisions of the Professional Standards Legislation, in Victoria, Queensland, Western Australia, South Australia, the Australian Capital Territory, and the Northern Territory.

The scheme will apply to ACS members who qualify as Certified Computer Professionals unless exempted by ACS and will be published on the ACS web site.
